



The control-group were parents, hospital-personnel.





Rett-Syndrompatients appeared to demonstrate similar fixation patterns compared to non-Rettpatients!!

NO significant Differences!

aze Technology





- two cameras built in
- Infrared-light shine a nearly imperceptible light on the eyes
- the camera "sees" the reflection of the light off the pupils
- an algorithm turns the information from the camera into "mouse" movement
- the user looks at a point on the screen and that is where the cursor goes or
- the user looks at a square on screen for apprx. 0,5 sec a click will be activated
- a synthetic voice speaks



















Parents voices:






- "They feel all the love given to them. They have a great sensitivity for love. I am sure of this.


