#### The Problem

Current websites fall short for students with disabilities like Rett Syndrome because these websites are designed for the general student population.

To start, these websites require parents and teachers to choose the difficulty level of each game before students can play. But it's hard to know which level to choose when students' math levels don't align to traditional grade levels. Thus, students might end up playing games that are too easy or too hard.

The engagement features on current websites also fall short for students with disabilities. For example, some websites have overwhelming animations that produce stress rather than enjoyment for students with cognitive disabilities. Other websites do very little to engage kids as they learn, so students quickly lose focus.
